Public Health Educator III

Part time (20 hrs/wk), Augusta: As the Public Health Educator III in the Maine Center for Disease Control, Oral Health Program, you will coordinate the statewide School Oral Health Program and will also be involved in coordinating, developing, and managing other health initiatives that address preventive oral health measures and specific oral health problems.

Responsibilities include management of grants and contracts with schools and community-based organizations, training and technical assistance to other agencies. Experience in public health or community-based oral health education efforts and/or a dental background is desirable but not required.

Qualifications: A Bachelor's Degree in Public Health, Community Health Education, or Health Education AND two (2) years experience in community or health education program planning, development, implementation, and evaluation OR a Master's Degree in Public Health.
